

THE WATERFOWL OUTLOOK POINT NEW BETHLEHEM, PA



The “Civic Caring Connection”, a collaboration between Keystone SMILES, Tom Seidle, New Bethlehem Mayor, and New Bethlehem Women’s Civic Club are joining efforts to build a handicap viewing platform along the Redbank Creek behind Broadwood Towers, between Water Street and Redbank Creek.

Broadwood Towers is a senior citizen apartment complex that

houses 66 residents. 8 of these residents are electric wheel chair bound. This will provide an opportunity for the residents and the community to enjoy the beautiful view along the Redbank Creek area to enjoy the seasonal waterfowl that migrate to the area.

The plans call for the platform to run along 30 feet of the creek and extend out between 10 to 30 feet from the steep bank. It

will be handicap accessible and several of the trees along the bank will be kept to provide shade.
