




9/11 DAY OF SERVICE AND REMEMBERANCE



Our preschool classrooms are in full swing of being back in school

Mercer County

Sharpsville Gardens Children's Learning Center has a full classroom of 17 children in their Pre-K Counts program this year. Miss Nicole is the PKC lead teacher and Miss Lonnie is her aide. The children have been getting to know each other and they have also been starting to recognize letters and writing.

AmeriCorps members Avery Ellis & Bradley Houser will focus on social behavioral skills and Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math, (STEM) lessons as part of their AmeriCorps term of service with Keystone SMILES AmeriCorps program. Currently, they are in deep preparation developing curriculum for three after school programs starting in October to be held in the Sharpsville Gardens, Mallable Heights, and Frank Fay Communities of the Mercer County Housing Authority.



WEED AND SEED

Venango County

Weed & Seed is an after-school program that operates in Oil City. This is a safe place youth can come to socialize, get homework help, and participate in STEM activities. They also receive an afterschool snack and a nutritious dinner before they go home. The program is open from 3:00 pm until 7:30 pm Monday and Tuesday on the lower level of Free Crossing Methodist Church on the East End and Wednesday & Thursday on the lower level of the Bethel Methodist Church in Siverly, Oil City. HOUSE OF TRADES FUTURE PROJECT

CLARION, Pa. (EYT) – The Clarion County Housing and Community Development Corporation, a nonprofit of the Clarion County Housing Authority, is excited to announce the upcoming opening of the Clarion Community Center on 2nd Avenue in Clarion, scheduled for early 2026.



The building, which has served the

community in many ways over the years—as the former ARC Building, Career Link, and originally the Coca-Cola Bottling Company—will soon reopen as a hub for local agencies, organizations, and residents.

The Clarion Community Center will feature:

- A community room available for use by local agencies, nonprofit organizations, and community groups.
- ·Office space dedicated to social service agencies to better serve the needs of Clarion County residents.
- ·A new mural on the side of the building, created through local partnerships.

Keystone SMILES AmeriCorps Service Opportunities

The project also includes a collaboration with Keystone SMILES Community Learning Center, a grantee for the Keystone SMILES AmeriCorps program. Participants in this service-learning program—locally referred to as the House of Trades—will help renovate and revitalize the facility space for the community room gaining hands-on training in skills such as drywall, painting, and electrical work.

AmeriCorps service is not employment; it's an opportunity to make a difference through service while members build their future through career exploration in community service. Members will:

- ·Serve a four-month term beginning in October 2025.
- Receive a gross living allowance of \$6,300, paid bi-monthly.
- ·Earn an education award of \$1,956.50 for future training, paying on federal loans, or coursework.
- •Qualify for federal student loan forbearance and interest repayment during service.
- ·Contribute to neighborhood revitalization and leave a lasting legacy through an AmeriCorps "Season of Service."

A Space for the Community

"The Community Center represents a new chapter for this historic building," said Executive Director Penny Campbell. "We want it to be a welcoming space where local organizations can connect with residents and where partnerships can grow."
